



## **Collared Sparrowhawk**

Name	Scientific	Accipiter cirrhocephalus
	Common	Collared Sparrowhawk.
Description		This is a small, slightly built hawk, the females being slightly larger than the males. The feathers are grey or brown above; the breast and underparts are beautifully striped chestnut and cream. The bill, eyes and legs are yellow.
Habitat		They prefer forests and woodlands, especially in areas where there are many small birds which they can hunt.
What it feeds on		Mainly small birds, including caged birds such as canaries and budgerigars.
Where it feeds		Prey is usually taken in flight.
Breeding		Breeding can take place between August and December. A nest is usually built in a fork of a tall tree and is made from sticks, often lined with green leaves. The same nest is used each year and often increases in size as more sticks are added. 2 or 3 eggs are usually laid and incubated mostly by the female.
Did you know?		This bird looks a lot like the brown goshawk but is smaller in size.
